## *Introduction*

This directory was initiated by the Rhode Island Department of Environmental Management (RIDEM) to support the many groups and organizations working to enhance Rhode Island's watersheds. The directory lists organizations and agencies in Rhode Island who can provide data, information and technical assistance to the numerous groups involved in watershed issues. The contents of the directory are not exhaustive. We know that there are groups that have been left out. It is our hope that this directory is a work in progress. As the directory is used, it will be updated and improved to create a comprehensive network of information for all watershed organizations in Rhode Island.

The directory includes information from numerous state and local government agencies, local non-government organizations, land trusts, and academic institutions from around Rhode Island and Massachusetts that are working in Rhode Island's watersheds. The directory features:

- ◆ An alphabetical list of all agencies and organizations included in the directory.
- ◆ Contact information for each agency and organization.
- ◆ Icons to quickly identify the type of assistance provided, whether it is technical assistance, general information, or raw data on the topic.
- ◆ A topical index to easily identify agencies and groups by their expertise.

The directory intentionally leaves out certain types of information that is provided in other current directories.
