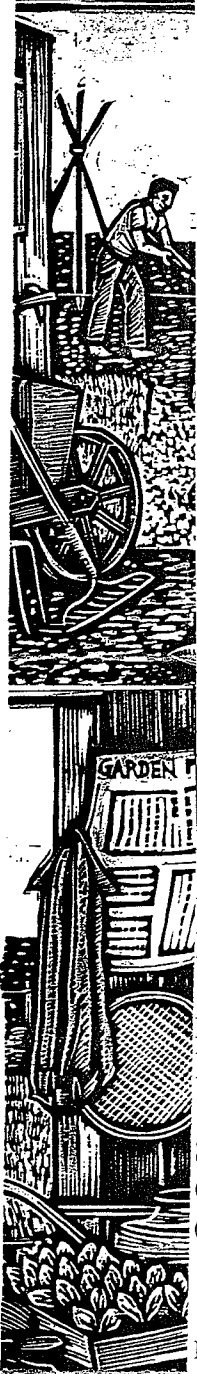

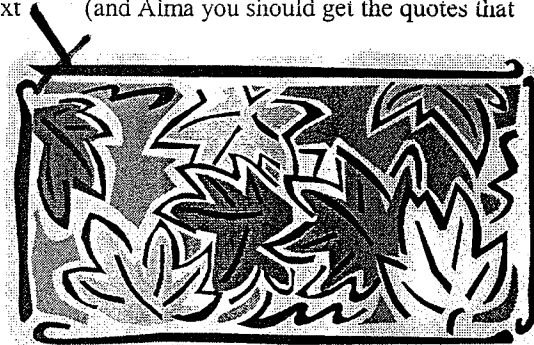
from the UEL Community Garden

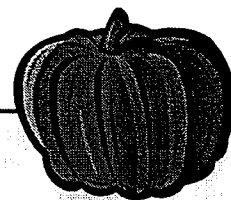

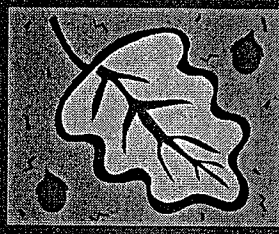


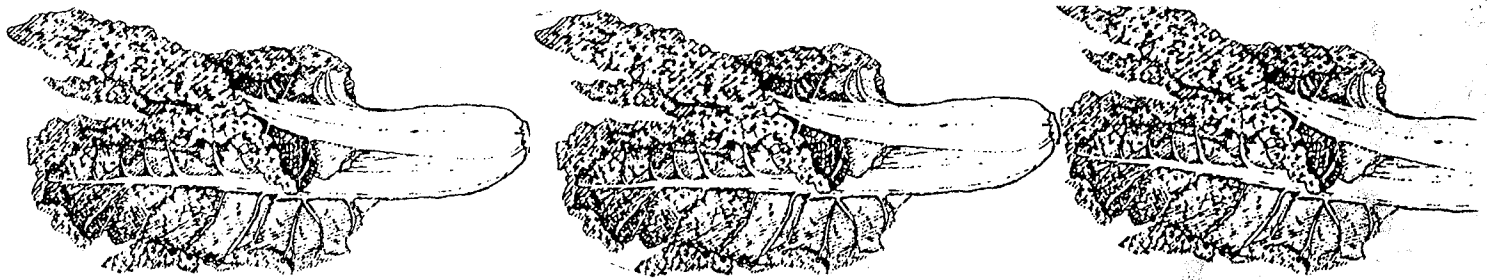
